



## **The Brigades of Antietam** edited by **Bradley M. Gottfried**


Using the words of enlisted men and officers, the book weaves a fascinating narrative of the role played by every infantry and cavalry brigade level unit (112 entries) from the time it began its march toward Sharpsburg to the final action at Shepherdstown. Organized by order of battle, each unit is thoroughly covered in detailing where it fought, its commander, the constitution of the unit, and its performance in the campaign.


## **The Artillery of Antietam** by **James A. Rosebrock**

Each unit is covered in detail, including its formation and history, commander, armament, and role in the Maryland Campaign. ## **The Commanders of Antietam** edited by **Kevin Pawlak and Bradley M. Gottfried**








## **Roads to Antietam by John W. Schildt**




### **The Artillery Atlas of Antietam by Aaron M. Holley and James A. Rosebrock**

Designed as a companion to *The Artillery of Antietam*, the atlas features 34 full-color 8½ by 11-inch maps originally published in *The Artillery of Antietam* and rendered specifically by cartographer Aaron Holley to highlight terrain and the artillery batteries that fought in the Maryland Campaign. James Rosebrock provides narration of the events on the page opposite each map.

Jacob Duryee commanded the 2nd Maryland Infantry and led the regiment in the assault on the Burnside Bridge. The Antietam Institute purchased the original manuscript of Duryee's memoirs and Antietam guide Michael Hill is editing this historically important work.






**[Elliot Burial Map] by S.G. Elliott**

In the spring of 2020, researchers discovered a map at the New York Public Library drafted by S.G. Elliott in 1864 that marked over 5,800 graves of Union and Confederate soldiers, as well as gathering places that marked where horses were brought to be burned. This remarkable resource confirms much of what we know about the locations of burial trenches from Alexander Gardner's battlefield photos and period sketches.



*The Antietam Base Map is a reconstruction of the 1862 battlefield landscape. By pairing historical references with modern geospatial technology, the battlefield was meticulously reconstructed in three dimensions, erasing modern intrusions to give the viewer a birds-eye view of the battlefield.
